#### From the Pastor's Desk

We are now coming into the most important times of the Christian year; Lent and Easter. To me, Easter is the highlight of the Christian year because it is the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead that gave birth to Christianity. We wouldn't celebrate Jesus' birth at Christmas if it weren't for the events of Easter. During Holy Week, we will remember the suffering and death of Jesus on the cross for the forgiveness of our sins, and then celebrate how God glorified Jesus by raising him from the dead after three days.

Lent is the 40-day period of repentance and renewal that precede Easter. It begins with Ash Wednesday, which is March 1 this year. The 40 days does not count the Sundays, because the Sundays during Lent are considered "little Easters." Lent is a period of time that allows us to recall the Easter story and absorb its meaning.

Observing Lent prepares us to celebrate Easter more fully through penitential practices, repentance, resolution, and participation. Penitential practices refers to practices of self-denial. Some people fast during this time. Others modify the fast by giving up a type of food they especially like. Others give up doing something they like during Lent. Whatever it is, the purpose is to help the person focus and understand the full meaning of Easter.

Repentance is, of course, confessing our sin and turning away from it. It is changing something in how we live our life. Resolution is making a commitment to develop more Christian habits and attitudes. Participation is to take part in the services and events of the Lenten season to renew and strengthen our faith. Whatever you do to observe Lent this year, I pray you have a glorious Easter season and that Christ becomes even more real to you through your Easter experience this year.

#### Bring a Friend to Church

It is widely said that the best form of evangelism is word of mouth. A person is more apt to come to church if they have been personally invited by someone they know. We would like to instill a culture of inviting people to attend our church, so we have started a program of Invite a Friend to Church Sunday once each quarter. The next official observance of this will be Sunday, April 3, 2017.

Invite one of your friends, neighbors, or family members to attend church with you on that day. Maybe you can invite them out or over to your house for lunch after the service and make more of an event out of it. Of course, it should be a habit to invite others to church every week. Chances are whomever you invite will not say "yes" the first time you invite them, but don't get discouraged. It often takes about a dozen invitations before someone accepts. We have a great church and a great congregation here, so we need to let everyone know about it. Let's try to fill up the sanctuary on April 3.

Once each quarter a team of people from our church picks up trash along Miller Road between Southern and Broadway. Our church sponsors this section of road, and there are signs posted to let everyone know that we do this. We start early in the morning and it usually only takes about an hour. #### **Items for Recycling**

Thanks everyone for bringing cans and clear plastic bottles for recycling. The church is raising some good money from this program, but we have found there are some items the local recyclers do not accept. They do not want aluminum foil or tin cans, so only bring cans for drinks and put all others (such as cans for vegetables) in your own recycle bin at home. In Items of plastic, they do not want the clear plastic wrapping like that for cakes and cookies and other such items nor plastic milk containers. So please put those in your recycle bin at home and only bring things like water containers.

## How to Reach New People Harold Warsop, Gary Taylor, and Pastor

**Bob** recently attended a workshop on How to Reach New People. The workshop was very enjoyable, eye-opening, and informative. The basic message was that the ways churches, including our church, have gone about trying to get new members up to now really only amounts to "waiting for people to come." That model did work to a certain degree 50 years ago, but does not work now.

Basically, we attract new members by creating and developing personal relationships. It comes down to the formula of "make a friend; be a friend; bring a friend to Christ." Each person in the church is charged with doing this. As you talk to friends or introduce yourself to a new neighbor, ask if they are associated with a church. If they are not, invite them to come to your church and check it out. Offer to pick them up and bring them yourself for their first Sunday. The best way to get new people in the church is to invite them personally. Word-of-mouth is the best form of advertising.

In addition, it is important to increase the church's visibility in the community. When possible, have meetings currently held at the church in a public setting. The pastor also needs to spend some office hours out in the public arena and spend less hours in the office. You will be hearing more about this in the near future.

#### The Upper Room

Our church makes available the *Upper Room* daily devotional booklets for your use. Each booklet covers two months, and both regular and large print editions are available. This does not come without some cost, however. We want you to take a copy and use it. All we ask is that you leave a donation of one dollar for each copy you pick up to help defray the expense. Go to goodsearch.com and type in "Community Church of Buckeye" in the box for the charity you wish to support and then click on the VERIFY button. Then for each search you do, the church gets a little over a penny. It really adds up over time.
